

Instructions to Authors

Jamahiriya Medical Journal

These requirements are in accordance with the uniform requirement for manuscript submitted to biomedical journals. (See *Annals of Internal Medicine* 1997;126(1);36-37.

A-Manuscript preparation:

1- Only Electronic submission as an attachment by E-mail is acknowledged for possible publication. Manuscript will not be returned to authors. Type entire manuscript double spaced on standard size (A4) on one side of the paper only with at least 25 mm margins. This includes reference lists, tables, figures and legends. Number pages consecutively in this order beginning with the title page, abstract, text, acknowledgments, references, tables, and legends. Begin each section on a separate page.

2- Complete the submission form from the website, which specifies (i) the type of submission (ii) the responsible author and his or her complete mailing address, telephone fax numbers and E-mail, (iii) a statement by the responsible author certifying that all co-authors have seen and agree to the contents of the manuscript.

3- On the title page provide a title of 80 spaces or less. List (each author's first and sur names), institutional affiliation and address. Indicate to whom reprint requests and communication should be sent. All manuscripts must be submitted in an acceptable English grammar.

4-Abstract:

Provide an abstract up to 250 words for original and review articles. This should be typed double spaced on a separate page. The abstract should be organized with background, purpose(s) of the study, basic procedure(s), results and conclusions. Clinical review article, abstracts should summarize the contents of the review articles. Include a list of 2-6 key words or short phrases and subject for indexing.

5-References:

The references should be updated and limited to essential. References should be numbered consecutively in order of citation and typed double spaced. Please list all authors if there are six or less; otherwise list only the first three, followed by 'et al'.

Authors are responsible for Bibliographic accuracy and must check every reference in Manuscript and proof read again in page proofs.

6-Tables:

- Type table double spaced each on a separate page. Number pages consecutively with text and provide a table number and title for each. Provide a footnote to each table identifying all abbreviations used.

7-Illustrations and Figures:

- Each figure should have a label indicating top, figure number and first Author.
For graphic, diagram, line drawing ...etc artwork should be done professionally. Labelling should allow for legibility following reduction to column width.

8- Figures legends:

Type double spaced on pages separate from the text. Identify at the end of each legend and in alphabetical order all abbreviations in the figure described.

Provide one (1) legend for each figure, and number legends in sequence. Number legend pages consecutively with the text. For Microphotography, indicate the stain used and use an internal scale marker.

B-Short communication:

This category comprises brief reports on topic relevant to JMJ reader and preliminary reports of original studies of relevant scientific importance.

Short communication must not exceed 2000 words including tables, figures and references.

C-Case report:

Case report will be considered for publication only if it concern unrecognized condition or offer new insight into pathophysiology, diagnosis or treatment of a disease. The abstract of case reports should not exceed 100 words and over all text not exceeded 2000 words including tables, figures and references.

D-Letter to the editor:

A letter to editor may be in response to an Article published in JMJ or may comment on a controversial issue. Letters should be brief, less than 250 words and undergo peer review.

Submission of an Article for publication implies the transfer of copyright from the author to the publisher upon acceptance. All manuscript will be peer reviewed and on the bases of the reviewer's comments, the editorial board reserves the right to accept or reject any paper.
